This year marks RSVP's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary at Triton College. For 40 years, this program has helped older adults find volunteer opportunities in the community. Through volunteers' support, local organizations have been able to provide more services to people in need.

"This amazing program not only helps community services but it also helps older adults live more fulfilled lives," said Mario Porras, current Director of RSVP.

The Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) is a grant-awarded program that is a branch of the national AmeriCorps organization. RSVP helps older adults (aged 55+) find volunteer opportunities in the community. The

In 1983, Triton College was awarded the first RSVP grant. At that time, one full-time employee led the program with a handful of volunteers serving in the community. Over the past 40 years, the program has grown and flourished. RSVP now serves communities in west suburban Cook and southern DuPage counties: has had over 500 volunteers enrolled in the program; has helped over a hundred community partners; currently has two fulltime and two part-time staff that administer the program. # **RSVP'\$ Tax Season**



For the past 33 years, RSVP has offered free tax preparation services to senior citizens in the

area through a program called Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE). TCE is a grant-funded program through the IRS that helps low- to moderate-income people aged 60 and over with free tax preparation and tax education.

Over the years, RSVP has helped educate hundreds of residents in the area and saved them thousands of dollars.

"We are very proud of this program because of the direct impact it has on the community," said Mario Porras, RSVP Director. RSVP recruits and trains volunteers to become IRS-certified tax preparers. Starting in late January, RSVP begins accepting calls to make appointments for tax preparation. The tax-certified volunteers are assigned to one of several sites around the area to help lessen travel for residents. Appointments start in February and stop in mid-April.

Mr. Porras says he's thankful and grateful to all of the volunteers and staff for their time and commitment; "it's because of them that this program is successful every year."

The nine sites this year were at: Melrose Park Public Library, Elmwood Park Public Library, Eisenhower Public Library, Proviso Township office, Westdale Park, Norridge Senior Assistance Center, Triton College, and the two new sites were La Grange Park Public Library and Schiller Park Community Center.

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) sponsors the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs. TCE offers free tax assistance to individuals aged 60 or older. The Revenue Act of 1978 authorizes IRS to enter into agreements (via grant competition) with private or nongovernmental public non-profit agencies and organizations which will provide training and assistance to volunteers who provide free tax counseling to elderly individuals. RSVP at Triton College has been awarded this grant and has offered this program since 1990.

# Volunteering is Important

Retirement is something that many people look forward to--no more long days of work and going to jobs you may not enjoy. After retirement, you can spend the rest of your life doing things you enjoy, whenever and with whomever you want. However, many people need or desire to stay productive so they can feel a sense of purpose.

Volunteering not only helps strengthen communities, but it also has important emotional and physical benefits, especially for people after retirement.

According to a study done by AmeriCorps, Americans over the age of 60 that volunteered reported lower disability and higher levels of well-being compared to those who did not volunteer. Whether that activity is helping with a local sports team or walking around your neighborhood while volunteering as a companion, maintaining a healthy level of fitness helps fend off diseases as you age.

Other benefits of volunteering include:

Improved Psychological Health - Research has shown



that volunteering leads to lower rates of depression and anxiety, especially for people 65 and older. Volunteering reduces stress and increases positive, relaxed feelings by releasing dopamine. Volunteers report feeling a sense of meaning

and appreciation by

spending time in service to others, both given and received, which can have a stress-reducing effect. Reduced stress further decreases the risk of some physical and mental health problems, such as heart disease, stroke, depression, anxiety, and general illness.

<u>Nurture New and Existing Relationships</u> -Volunteering increases social interaction and helps prevent senior isolation. One of the best ways to make new friends and strengthen existing relationships is to participate in a shared activity. Volunteers have reported that through their service, they have met new friends and added new hobbies to their life.

<u>Bridge the Generation Gap</u> - By interacting with younger generations, seniors are able to share important life lessons. On the flip side, younger generations are able to teach seniors new ways of looking at life. By building a connection with each other, both generations can offer the respect and affirmation that humans crave.

Volunteering is best for all parties involved when you are doing something you enjoy. It's never too late to get started. Whether you just retired or are in your later years, there is an opportunity out there for you.
