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J. Murphy stated that the Respiratory Care Degree program is being reactivated. P. Jaswilko added this program was closed over ten years ago. All courses needed to be rewritten and submitted as new courses due to content change throughout the years to accommodate the National Board Exam. The job market is phenomenal. The degree includes twenty new courses. M. Flaherty asked if the program and courses require ICCB approval. J. Murphy responded they do. P. Jaswilko added that he is separately working on the program accreditation. M. Flaherty is glad this program is returning.

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P. Jaswilko added the program will become effective Fall 2023, pending ICCB and accreditation approvals. Timeline is on schedule, hoping for a mid- May approval. S. Campos added that she anticipates we will obtain approval by the HLC and ICCB in time for Fall, otherwise it will become effective for Spring 2024.

M. Flaherty made a motion, seconded by G. Jablonski, to approve item numbers 22-162 through 22-182, passed unanimously with a virtual vote, by a show of hands.

J. Murphy stated that the program prerequisites were reorganized for the Health, Sport and Exercise Science AAS Degree, Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs) were updated to coincided with the current assessment work. PLOs were reduced from eight to five in the AAS Degree. Stackable programs were added to each program. In communication with the high schools, suggestions were made to add elective options was completed, with no change to core courses. Health, Sport and Exercise Science Degree students can complete the two-year degree, with the option to take the third year, Sport Management. Students can then continue on to complete the fourth year by taking online courses through Concordia or another university. ACC 101 was added as an option in Sport Management. PED 121 and HTH 202 were added to Instructional Wellness. All certificates consist of 3 courses totaling 9 credits. Personal Training elective options were removed and replaced with a statement, as the list was getting too long.

W. Griffin made a motion, seconded by M. Flaherty, to approve item numbers 22-183 through 22-187, passed unanimously with a virtual vote, by a show of hands.

J. Murphy stated that we need to be committed to completing the outstanding coursework of adding the Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) and update the Assessment fields. She sent out an email to the College Curriculum Committee (CCC) and the Technical Review Committee (TRC) in regards to completing this work. There have been issues with accessing the Watermark (WM) modules, which S. Misasi Maratto and she are working on to solve this problem. They will contact WM for the correct rights so everyone has access to make a 'Comment' at any workflow stage the document is in. S. Misasi Maratto is trying several tactics to add the 'rights' to all individuals. We told WM that they were sent a list of users and their roles and explained their roles in the workflow. WM did not enter the all the rights needed. S. Misasi Maratto working to clean up the User Roles. The goal for the CCC and TRC by the end of the Fall semester, is to access and properly utilize WM in the Spring. She asked for persons to contact her or S. Misasi Maratto if they are having issues, i.e. cannot 'make a comment' or cannot access. Some of the problems have been solved. S. Misasi Maratto is cleaning up what WM was requested to do. We need to add roles to users for the correct access.

Reminder: **J. Murphy reminded faculty and deans that ALL CLOs need to be updated.** The Course Syllabus Assessment Strategies need to match the Assessment Outcomes in the Self-Study module in WM. The Self-Study and Curriculum modules do not communicate with each other. This needs to be completed before Fall semester ends. We do not want issues in the future that the CLOs and Instructional Strategies in Curriculum Management are not current. All course and syllabus submissions are being checked by S. Misasi Maratto
