The meeting began at 2:05 pm.

Topics discussed included:

1. Pamela Perry presented on the HLC Assurance Argrument Outline and specifically for this committee regarding Criterion Three. She explained that the goal is to get feedback and work on issues prior to the HLC visit. The President mentioned this as well at the faculty workshop. Committee members were encouraged to submit feedback of positive and negative comments regarding the criterion. This could be done via email or sent as interoffice mail.

2. Technology Update from Humberto Espino: As part of the FY17 technology-need upgrades, during this fall we are converting the following classrooms into smartclassrooms:

G306A, G306B, G308, G310A, G310B, G206, G207, G209, D208, T142 (+2 TBD)

These new smart-classrooms should be fully operational at the start of the spring semester.

- Humberto asked that faculty let their Dean's know of any technology needs within the areas that they teach.
  - 3. From Sara Gallagher:

We're trying something new! Faculty Friday is a webinar based professional development opportunity for faculty, by faculty. 30 minute sessions will be held on the first Friday of month at 10 a.m. via Collaborate Ultra in the Blackboard Learn Faculty Forum or the link sent via email. The sessions will be recorded and available to view in the forum. Overtime, we hope to build a collection of faculty development videos. Our first webinar was held on Friday, September 2 and Serpil Caputlu, College Readiness and Mathematics Instructor presented a workshop titled "Using Blackboard Collaborate Ultra: A Faculty Insight". Our next webinar is on

Friday, October 7 at 10 a.m. Gabe Guzman and Richard Chan present on assessment techniques in their workshop titled "How do you know they're getting it?". Have a topic you want to share? Please send your idea to e-support@triton.edu

Faculty Friday is available and so far, is a success. Any faculty not able to attend at the time of the webinar, are encouraged to view the recorded session.

4. "In-House" faculty training program A Draft Proposal for Online Teacher Certification at Triton was distributed in the May meeting. The generic proposal includes two tracks; the first gives instructors the opportunity to teach online courses; the second is for instructors interested in developing their own courses.

From the May 2016 meeting, Marianna suggested the proposal to be loaded on to the Blackboard shell for everyone to review. The Online Teacher Certificate should be presented as an alternative to increase



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or enhance online courses. Marianna asked if the committee agreed for Element I of the proposal to be presented to the Senate next week. Everyone agreed.

Further discussions included putting the following items on Blackboard:

1. the compilation of the different approaches from other programs 2. draft proposal for Online Teacher Certification at Triton

Additional goals of the committee include:

Review of the current online course proposals and retention within online courses. The current forms will be put on Blackboard for review. The retention of online courses and some possible improvements will be discussed at future meetings once the current items have been approved.
