Electronic Vehicle Technology*

As the automotive industry shifts toward innovative and sustainable solutions, our Automotive and Engineering Technology programs will offer programming to support this growing industry. Certification will be offered as a stackable credential for the charging station installation and maintenance certificate, ensuring students gain the practical skills needed to remain at the forefront of emerging technologies.



Forklift Operator

To address the growing demand in manufacturing, Triton introduces the Forklift Operator Certificate. This program provides students with the knowledge and hands-on experience to operate forklifts safely and efficiently, preparing them for immediate employment opportunities.

Associate in Engineering Science*

Starting this fall, Triton will offer an Associate in Engineering Science degree, providing students with a strong foundation in engineering principles. Graduates of this two-year program will benefit from easy transfer into the University of Illinois' Grainger College of Engineering or other possible four-year universities in Illinois, streamlining their pathway to a bachelor's degree in engineering. Thanks to a grant from the U.S. Department of Energy, five students in the program will receive scholarships to cover college costs and will participate in a paid summer internship with physicists at Fermilab after their first year.

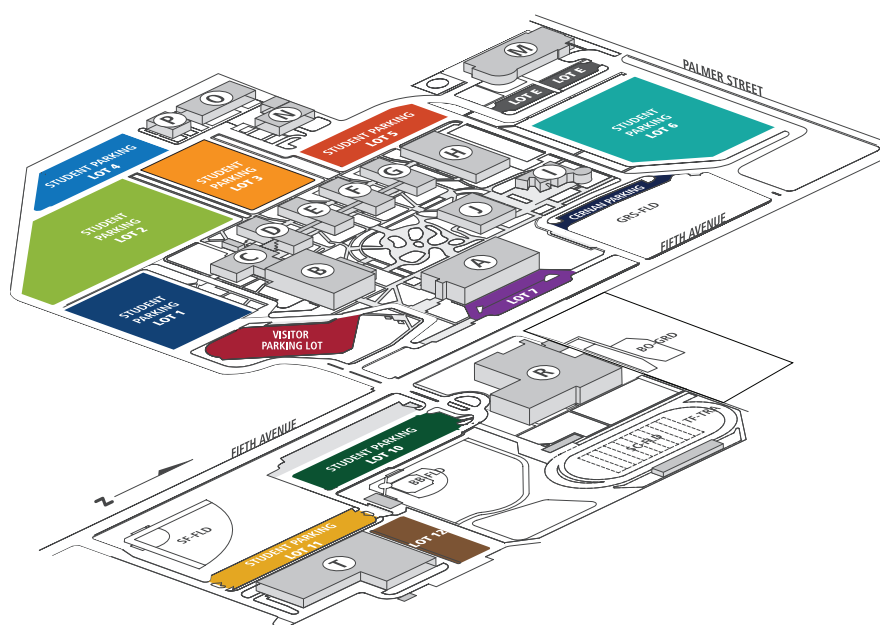
