- Pride Month Planning: Preparations are underway for Pride Month events, including the college's first Pride Picnic, scheduled for June 24.



- Student Satisfaction Survey: The student satisfaction survey remains open beyond the initial May 3 deadline to boost participation. Continued efforts include web team collaboration to keep promotional materials live and additional reminder emails being sent. Plans include sending another email campaign via Mainstay, with updated messaging through a custom send.
 - As of this morning, around 763 responses have been received. Hitting 950 responses would reduce the margin of error by 3%.
 - This year's participation is significantly higher than last year's (701), reflecting improvements made to simplify access for students.
 - Email remains the most effective method of reaching students. It is more effective than social media or printed materials. Spikes in responses consistently follow email reminders.
 - The survey will remain open through graduation week.
