Approval of Minutes

A motion to approve the minutes of the June meeting was made by Katie Rullo and seconded by Colleen Rockafellow.

Ι. Academic Affairs – Katie Rullo

Arts & Science:

- We have a new Associate Dean of Arts & Sciences, Michael Thunberg. He started in this role on August 11th.
- The first cohort of students for the Associate of Engineering Science degree has officially started August 18th.

Business and Tech:

• There is a new Automotive instructor Paul Zelek.

Continuing Education:

- Early College sections of Dental Assistant and Physical Therapy Aide started August 11th. This is a new partnership with CE (Continuing Education) and Early College where high school students are coming to campus and completing vocational training opportunities through our Center for Health Professionals. A new cohort will begin this Spring 2026 for students interested in EKG Technician.
- During the month of August, CE was recently approved by the IDFPR (Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation) to offer the Field Event Exam for Home Inspection students. This now allows us to provide both the 60-hour class and field event exam so students can complete the entire pre-license criteria for the Home Inspection license through Triton College.

Adult Education:

- The Secretary of State Adult Volunteer Literacy grant was renewed for another year. The Access to Literacy program offers free tutoring services to native and non-native English speakers who wish to improve their basic reading, writing, math, or English conversational skills with flexible scheduling.
- The Adult Education (AE) Westlake Elevate Healthcare Scholarship was renewed for an additional five years. The scholarship supports Adult Education students pursuing a degree or certification in the healthcare field. This Fiscal Year, 23 students have been awarded the scholarship, working towards degrees in Nursing, Radiologic Technician, Respiratory Therapy and certifications in Pharmacy Technician.

- Additional New Course: Microsoft Office Specialist IET (Integrated Education and Training), working with CE to provide AE students with a course to prepare them to take the Microsoft Office Specialist - Excel certification exam.
- Adult Education classes beginning next week.
- Registration for off-site ESL classes this week. (Off-sites are East Leyden High School, Rhodes School and Dynamic Manufacturing, Inc.).

Health Careers:

- Barber/Cosmetology Salon space is completed.
- There are two new nursing faculty and a new chair for nursing assistant.
- We have selected a new part-time program assistant and a new full-time office assistant for Nursing, Nursing Assistant, and the office of Associate Dean Ty Perkins and hope to have them here next week.

Portal & System Updates:

- The portal experienced a minor outage on August 18th.
- It was being monitored as a nationwide issue.

New Portal Cards:

- 2 HR-related cards added:
 - One summarizes your pay stub.
 - One provides a snapshot of your leave balances (no need to log into self-service).
- 2 Microsoft-linked cards added:
 - After signing in, shows:
 - Top 10 recent emails (Triton email).
 - Top 10 OneDrive documents.
 - Clicking on any item opens it directly.

Software Updates:

- Colleague 6.5 has been rolled out.
- Self-Service updated to version 3.7:
 - Faculty can now see deadline dates (midterms, final grades, etc.) in their rosters.
 - o Students can also view these dates in their schedules.
 - A frequently requested feature since moving away from WebAdvisor.

Strategic Goals:

- Portal updates and added functionalities align with FY25 Operational Assembly goals.
- Done in partnership with IT.

VI. Guided Pathways – Shelley Tiwari

Library Chair Shekinah Lawrence shared information about a new program called Troy's Campus Quest Troy's Quest Starter Kit:

- Given to newly enrolled and early college students.
- Includes:
 - Destination map with quest locations.
 - o Instructions for participating.
 - o First Troy Destination card from the library (starting point for all).

How the Game Works:

- Students visit campus "quest destinations" (support services).
- At each location, they:
 - Ask for a Troy card.
 - Learn about that department's resources.
 - Collect up to 15 cards (out of 18 possible).
 - o Goal: encourage engagement and familiarity with campus support areas.

Prizes & Incentives:

- 5 cards: Earn a button.
- 6–14 cards: Button + snack voucher (choose sweet or savory).
 - Sweet = cookie from HIA Bakery (B Building).
 - Savory = bag of chips.
- 15+ cards: Entered into drawing for a free class (5 available for Spring).
 - o Drawing: Thursday, October 9 at the Library.

Purpose & Benefits:

- Fun way to engage new students with key campus departments.
- Encourages face-to-face interaction and awareness of services.
- Promotes programs like HIA through snacks (cookies can spark interest in baking classes).
- Opportunity for staff to share info organically (Transfer Center guidance, for example).
- Optional clues/hints may be provided at "clue centers" like Library or Career Services.

Data Collection & Assessment:

- Metrics to track:
 - Number of cards distributed by departments.
 - o Number of completed game cards returned.
 - Snack voucher usage.
 - Student usage of participating services throughout the semester.
- Results to be reviewed in Winter to refine for next Fall.

Campus-Wide Participation:

- Departments encouraged to decorate destination signs for visibility.
 - Inspired by Health Services' creative example.
- Signs are numbered to match student maps.
- Library is both starting and ending point for all players.

Additional Notes:

- 500 starter kits distributed during Welcome Week via Student Life.
- Available afterwards at the library.
- Existing students can collect cards and participate, but only receive buttons, not grand prizes.
- Planning to expand next year with more sponsors and prizes.
