The Triton College **Wrestling Team** was congratulated on a great season! They were Region 4 Champions, Great Lakes District Champs, and had qualifiers for the national tournament in every weight class. Head Coach **Tim Duggan** was named Great Lakes District Coach of the Year, and two student athletes were named NJCAA All-Americans: **Anthony Schickel** (for the second year in a row) and **Ghee Rachal**.
