Triton College Celebrates Native American Heritage Month by Showcasing Little Wound's Warriors

RIVER GROVE, III. – Triton College's Heritage Committee and the Professional Development Center is celebrating Native American Heritage Month by showcasing the documentary *Little Wound's Warriors* on Thursday, Nov. 2, 3:30-4:30 p.m., at the Cernan Earth and Space Center. Admission is free.

After the film presentation, audience members can participate in a question-and-answer reception with director and Triton instructor Seth McClellan to discuss the creation of the documentary.

Little Wound's Warriors, a 2017 documentary, focuses on the hardships of young, Native Americans residing on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota.

"I hope to raise awareness of the complex challenges they face and also the strengths of young people on Native reservations," said McClellan.
