NEW BUSINESS

A. ACTION EXHIBITS:

- i. **College Curriculum Committee Recommendations**
Vice President Susan M. Campos presented the College Curriculum Committee recommendations. The recommendations include curriculum updates, course modifications, and program inactivation across multiple disciplines. Programs identified for inactivation include Biotechnology, Hospitality (Restaurant and Beverage Management), and Horticulture due to low enrollment and completion rates. The updates also include a redesign of the Automotive Technology curriculum to improve course structure and student progression.
- ii. **Surgical Science- Purchase of Transvaginal Ultrasound Simulator Education Package**
Vice President Susan M. Campos presented the purchase of a Transvaginal Ultrasound Simulator Education Package for the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program in an amount not to exceed \$48,875, funded through Perkins FY 2026. The simulator will provide students with hands-on, industry-relevant training and enhance clinical skill development.

iii. **Updated Course Fees for Fall 2026 Inclusive Access Program Courses**

Vice President Susan M. Campos presented updated course fees for Fall 2026 ACCESS program courses. The ACCESS program integrates the cost of instructional materials into course fees, ensuring students have access to required resources at the start of the term. The program supports student success by reducing barriers to course materials while maintaining the option for students to opt out.

OTHER

Vice President Campos shared several institutional updates and recognitions.

Triton College has been named an Achieving the Dream Leader College, recognizing the institution's commitment to student success, access, and equity. Additionally, Triton College has been recognized as an Aspen Prize Top 200 community college, highlighting strong student outcomes and institutional performance.

Additional updates included continued growth of the Early College program and acknowledgment of recent achievements within the college community.
