

Program Overview

- The first three years are offered by Triton with the final year in PNW's Nursing Program.
- For students earning a BSN, no more than 86 credit hours from Triton College can be transferred.
- It is recommended that students apply for admission to PNW at least one semester prior to completing the degree to ensure that all appropriate coursework is completed prior to entry.
- Students must meet all prerequisite coursework and must maintain a 2.3 GPA at Triton College to remain eligible for potential admission to this program.
- Triton College students must: 1) complete an online application, 2) request a final, official transcript to
