Trojans Make History with Record-Setting Win Streak

RIVER GROVE, III. — The Triton College women's basketball team has made school history.

After Saturday's 64-46 victory over Bryant & Stratton College in Milwaukee, the Trojans racked up their 16th consecutive win of the season, breaking the program record for the longest winning streak previously set by the 1982-83 women's team.

"It's a great accomplishment for us to break the school record," head coach [Drew Winston](#) said. "But I'm thinking about how we played. We were not at our best today, and I want us to clean up some things in the final three games to get ready for the playoffs."

The Trojans (19-8) have all but secured the top seed heading into the Region 4 Division I Tournament, which [Triton will host](#) beginning March 4. Triton is 13-0 against Region 4 Division I opponents.

The win in Milwaukee was a homecoming for sophomores [Jazzmine Smith](#) and [Jayla Rankin](#), who played together about 10 minutes away at Wisconsin Lutheran High School.

Smith led the Trojans with 14 points, seven rebounds and five steals, while Rankin continued her NJCAA All-American push with 11 points, nine assists and seven steals.

The Trojans' defense forced 35 Bobcats turnovers, leading to 40 points. Triton finished with 28 steals. As a team, the Trojans rank third in the nation in steals, averaging just under 17 per game.

Triton will look to continue its record-setting streak when it returns to the Jorndt Athletic Complex for its final home game of the regular season Thursday, Feb. 19, against Malcolm X College. Tipoff is 5 p.m.
