Wester verified with UIC, that MAT 101 transfers, but does not count as fulfilling the Quantitative Literacy requirement, which then the students would need to take an additional Math course. She suggested adding MAT 102 as an option with MAT 101. G. Jablonski stated that UIC has different requirements than other colleges and may look at this in the future, but many students only take MAT 102. B. Decker stated that he would bring back to Curriculum to adjust in the future when revising the programs for the guided pathway.

education/Humanities or Fine Arts' OR SOC 100', and; add 'electives' (3 hours) to semester three; and change Community Studies electives in semester 4 from 9 to 3 credits.

Bohleke stated that mindset runs counterproductive to the guided pathways objective. M. Flaherty disagreed with H. Bohleke. J. Cody concurred with M. Flaherty to give students a choice. C. Antonich added that the goal of guided pathways is to be more seamless and not offer too many courses (choices) that not enough students enroll in. J. Cody questioned if the courses are made available. D. McNamara noted there will be much discussion within different areas and he will be revising his programs again in the Fall, but right now the focus is to bring the total credits down to 60. M. Flaherty also agreed that this discussion be postponed to Fall. L. Wester noted that the prerequisite for MCM 120 is RHT 101, but they are listed in the same semester. **D. McNamara will move RHT 101 to an earlier semester and suggested leaving the general education elective open to students for the time being, and he will discuss the proposed changes with S. McClellan. L. Wester added that S. McClellan specifically listed Social & Behavioral Science elective and also listed World Religions, which is not needed and should be removed. D. McNamara will revise the program with the suggested revisions.** M. Flaherty added the main change that needs to occur today is to reduce the program to 60, and adjust the prerequisite for MCM 120 (RHT 101) and list the appropriate number of Humanities.

M.A. Olson stated that in Secondary Education only one Math course is necessary and must be Algebra or Statistics. MAT 110 is accepted at some schools and Statistics at other schools. Discussion occurred as to which MAT is College-level Math. MAT 110 is not a gen-ed, but students would need to take if it is a prerequisite to a higher Math course. M.A. Olson noted that the State requires MAT 110 or higher. **MAT 110 will be listed as an elective and MAT 170 will be listed as a general education requirement.** J. Murphy asked if all students take two Math courses. M.A. Olson replied that it seems the State is moving in that direction. Elementary Education (MAT 116 and MAT 117) will not change and Secondary Education will be revised.

L. Wester introduced the subject of course repeatability, which a discussion ensued and stated that is repeatability the number of times a course can be taken for credit or for the number of times Financial Aid will cover. W. Griffin stated that, per discussion with S. Misasi Maratto, when a course is repeated, and not approved by ICCB for repeatability, the College does not receive reimbursement and that is why he is changing some of his courses to be one time repeatable. L. Wester stated that we have a course repeatability policy, does it need to be stated on the course proposal. J. Murphy stated there are two types of repeatability. S. Misasi Maratto stated that we need to receive approval from the State for a course to be repeatable and receive reimbursement, with a rationale as to why the course would be repeatable. J. Murphy questioned W. Griffin if he intends to grant credit for each time the student takes the course. K. Li stated that all courses should be repeatable across the board, e.g. for gen-ed courses that can be repeated three times for a total of four times and we would be reimbursed. S. Misasi Maratto stated that is not correct. If the course is not approved for repeatability by the State, we are not reimbursed. L. Wester stated the college policy for students are allowed to repeat the course and will be granted the higher grade, but not receive credit more than once. She questioned what would be the reason to list the number of repeats for a course on the Course Proposal. A. Turner replied that the number of times a course can be repeated that is listed on the Course Proposal would be intended for reimbursement. L. Wester questioned then should every course be updated to be repeatable. S. Misasi Maratto replied that asking for a course to be granted to be repeatable requires a valid rationale to the State, e.g. to improve a skill set, etc. J. Murphy questioned if the State automatically grants reimbursement for a course repeated one time without marking on the Course Proposal. S. Misasi Maratto replied that we do not receive reimbursement for any course that is repeated and is not approved for repeatability with the State. W. Griffin stated that is why he has added 1 time repeatable to some of his courses. J. Murphy stated there are two different repeatable options and only one is listed on the Course Proposal. M. Flaherty suggested postponing this discussion regarding repeatability to the Fall. L. Wester stated for clarification the repeatability listed on the Course Proposal has nothing to do with repeatability for credit.

OTHER: A.) Representation at the CCC Meeting – J. Murphy

J. Murphy read an excerpt from the CCC Handbook that representation by the submitter is mandatory or a designated proxy at the CCC meeting and she is not in favor of changing.

W. Griffin stated that submitters should not post their revision back in BlackBoard, but need to send revisions to S. Misasi Maratto for inclusion in the packet.

M. Flaherty stated that today special because we needed to approve the AA emphases to bring down to 60 credits, as the AA Degree requirements have been ICCB approved at 60 credit hour minimum. L. Wester added that when suggestions are made in the TRC and they are not included in the packet, they are actually reviewing the item(s) more than once. C. Antonich noted if the recommendations are not addressed in TRC, the item(s) will not be put on the agenda for the CCC meeting and if the submitter needs clarification they should question and speak with the person making the suggestion for clarification. M. Flaherty added that the changes being made for the guided pathways are not going to affect students as much as today's changes of bringing down to 60 credits. J. Murphy noted that V. McCullum made sure everyone under him went into the TRC to make corrections. Sometimes noticed at Agenda Planning corrections are not made and have to go back to submitter. C. Antonich add that there was a tremendous amount of work today with this large packet. K. Li added a lot of work was done prior to this meeting.

B.) iLaunch, Acceleration and Prerequisites – K. Li

K. Li stated that some courses for iLaunch Acceleration are not included on the student's transcript. Students start with MAT 045, skipping MAT 055 and MAT ~~085080~~ to MAT 110. We will begin to put on the students' transcript. He

informed everyone that this may have implications for the Health Care programs that are on a point system. Those grades associate with accelerated MAT course may not be on the transcript. A. Turner stated that they need to revisit the prerequisites for some of the Math courses that would need to go through the curriculum process, e.g. courses that require a Math prerequisite to state that students who repeated this course would be eligible for the next course and also address the length of time from completion and taking the next class. J. Murphy questioned if the student should be taking the courses in consecutive semesters as discussed at the last meeting. K. Li replied they are currently working on a policy to address these issues, as they want students to continue taking the consecutive courses without taking a break. H. Bohleke stated that if there is nothing that shows the student has completed the requirements, why not put on the student's transcript noting they completed the requirements and added that he does not see how they can take next course if the completion of MAT 045, MAT 085, etc. is not documented on the transcript. C. Antonich noted this conversation should occur outside of the Curriculum meeting.
