### <u>Energy Sense - Clean Energy Career Resources</u>





#### **Greencorps Chicago**



Greencorps Chicago is best known for their green industry job training program. This program is designed to be accessible and catered towards those with barriers to employment. Upon completion of the job program, participants gain industry-relevant skills and hands-on experience in outdoor restoration and sustainability work. Greencorps also runs a youth program for teens in Chicago Public Schools. This experiential learning program runs during the summer months, with seasonal positions available to work as an instructor or assistant instructor. Throughout the course of the program, students are taught a variety of environmental topics, build their own bikes, and get hands-on work experience in horticulture and ecological restoration.

### **Student Conservation Association**



The Student Conservation Association or SCA, is a nonprofit organization that provides outdoor work opportunities caring for and restoring nature. With a specific focus on opportunities for current students or recent graduates, there are opportunities to fit many different schedules. One Earth Collective is a nonprofit organization based in Oak Park IL. In addition to being active throughout the year supporting conservation and climate friendly causes, in April each year they collaborate with Chicagoland organizations (like Triton College) to hold the One Earth Film Festival. This week-long event culminates in watch parties of films across the Chicagoland area focused on a variety of environmental topics, along with action-inspired discussions .
