As a member of an institution that participates in the ASTC Travel Passport Program, you are eligible for benefits, such as free GENERAL ADMISSION when you travel outside of your local area to other participating institutions. (Check astc.org/passport for benefit details.)

These benefits DO NOT include free or discounted admission to special exhibits, planetarium and large screen theater presentations, nor do they include museum store discounts and other benefits associated with museum membership unless stated otherwise.

ASTC PASSPORT EXCLUSIONS

1. Science centers and museums located within 90 miles* of the Cernan Earth and Space Center.
2. Science centers and museums located within 90 miles* of the visitor's residence.

* This distance is measured "as the crow flies," meaning it is based on the linear radius, not driving distance.

How Our Universe Is Expanding

Since 2015, the Cernan Earth and Space Center has undergone numerous technical upgrades.

2015 – Installation of a fulldome digital projection system and new seating.

2019 – New computers and software to drive the digital Planetarium.

2019-2025 – Incremental improvements to the sound system to provide real 5.1 surround sound.

2022-2023 – Addition of the interactive touch table in the exhibit hall running Stellar Playground or Colonize Mars software.

2025 – Installation of a new laser phosphor digital projector to replace the 10-year-old original one.

2026? – Several projects are in development now, but we cannot say what they are or when they might occur.



The Cernan Earth and Space Center is named for astronaut Eugene A. Cernan (CAPT, USN, Retired) who was born on March 14, 1934, and raised in suburban Bellwood, not far from the Triton College campus where the Cernan Earth and Space Center is located.

Before becoming an astronaut, Gene Cernan was an American naval officer, naval aviator, electrical engineer, aeronautical engineer and fighter pilot. He flew aboard the Gemini 9, Apollo 10 and Apollo 17 missions. In December 1972, Captain Cernan was the last astronaut to leave his footprints on the lunar surface.
