## Cost of Attendance

The student's cost to attend college, known as "cost of attendance," includes tuition and fees, as well as such living expenses as food, housing, and transportation while attending school. The school estimates the cost of attendance following guidelines established by federal regulation.

Financial need is determined by an equation that balances the cost of attendance with the student's expected family contribution. The expected family contribution (EFC) is calculated on the FAFSA application. When the expected family contribution is less than the cost of attendance, the student has demonstrated a "need" for financial assistance.
