


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Triton College Unveils New Barber and Cosmetology Facility, Hosts Orientation Event



RIVER GROVE, III. — Triton College's Barber and Cosmetology Program will host a combined Information Session, Orientation, and Registration event on Wednesday, Aug. 13, in the program's brand-new learning facility.

Sessions will be held at 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. inside the new lab in Room M-150 (M Building). Meet the faculty, explore Triton's state-of-the-art facility, and learn how you can be part of this exciting and growing field.

Construction on the new space for barber and cosmetology students wrapped up this summer. It features 20 salon and barber stations, a wash house for shampooing hair, space for manicures and pedicures, a skincare room, and areas for classroom instruction and lectures.

"It's the real deal," said Donita Mitchell, cosmetology faculty member, adding that stepping into the new facility is like walking into a sophisticated salon or barbershop. Upon entry, guests will be welcomed by an inviting reception area. Hard to miss are the lustrous white floors, the sleek black leather salon chairs that sit on swivels, and the polished wooden styling stations. "Seeing the facility come together from the diagrams on paper—seeing it come to life—is just amazing to witness," Mitchell said.

The Barber and Cosmetology Certificates each require 50 credit hours, equivalent to the 1,500 clock hours mandated by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation. Once students complete their respective certificates, they will be eligible to pursue state licensure.
