






Chart 1: Educational Attainment within Triton District

# **Race/Ethnicity Distribution within Triton District**




Chart 2: Race/Ethnicity Distribution

# **Age Group Distribution within Triton District**




Chart 3: Age Group Distribution within Triton District




Chart 4: Fall Enrollment Gender, Fall 2021




Chart 5: Fall Enrollment Race/Ethnicity by Gender, Fall 2021




Chart 6: Fall Enrollment Age Distribution, Fall 2021




Chart 7: Fall 2021 Enrollment Pell Eligible Data Source: 10th-day data



#### **Enrollment Trend in the Fall Term, 2017-2021**






Chart 9: Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, 5-yr trend




Chart 10: Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, Credit Load Data Source: 10-day data

Average Student Credit Load in the Fall Term, 2017-2021




Chart 11: Fall Enrollment Average Credit Load, 5-yr Trend

Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, 2017-2021 by Gender




Chart 12: Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, Gender




Chart 13: Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, Residency

Average Age of Students Enrolled in Fall Term, 2017-2021




Chart 14: Fall Enrollment Average Age, 5-yr Trend

#### Credit Hour Enrollment by Student Type in Fall Term, 2017-2021





Chart 15: All Students Credit Hours




Chart 17: Non Credit Students Credit Hours Data Source: 10th-day data




Chart 18: New Students Credit Hours Data Source: 10th-day data




Chart 19: Fiscal Year Completions – 5-yr Trend Data Source: IPEDS Fall Completions Report



# Retention Rate of Full-Time, First-Time Degree/Certificate Seeking Students By Attendance Status and Cohort Year






Chart 22: Graduation Rate by Cohort Year – 5-yr Trend Data Source: IPEDS Graduation Rate Report, Winter FY2021


