






Chart 1: Educational Attainment within Triton District

## Race/Ethnicity Distribution within Triton District




Chart 2: Race/Ethnicity Distribution

## Age Group Distribution within Triton District




Chart 3: Age Group Distribution within Triton District




Chart 4: Fall Enrollment Gender, Fall 2022




Chart 5: Fall Enrollment Race/Ethnicity by Gender, Fall 2022




Chart 6: Fall 2022 Enrollment Age Distribution




Chart 7: Fall 2022 Enrollment Pell Eligible




Chart 8: Fall 2022 Enrollment First Generation




Chart 9: Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, 5-yr trend

### Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, 2018-2022 by Credit Load




Chart 10: Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, Credit Load

### Average Student Credit Load in the Fall Term, 2018-2022




Chart 11: Fall Enrollment Average Credit Load, 5-yr Trend




Chart 12: Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, Gender




Chart 13: Fall Term Enrollment Headcount, Residency

## Average Age of Students Enrolled in Fall Term, 2018-2022




Chart 14: Fall Enrollment Average Age, 5-yr Trend

## Credit Hour Enrollment by Student Type in Fall Term, 2018-2022




Chart 15: All Students Credit Hours




Chart 16: Credit Students Credit Hours




Chart 17: Non Credit Students Credit Hours




Chart 18: New Students Credit Hours




Chart 19: Fiscal Year Completions – 5-yr Trend




Chart 20: 8-yr Outcomes for Full-Time First-Time Degree/Certificate Seeking Students

### Retention Rate of Full-Time, First-Time Degree/Certificate Seeking Students By Attendance Status and Cohort Year




Chart 21: Fall to Fall Retention by Cohort Year – 5-yr Trend




Chart 22: Graduation Rate by Cohort Year – 5-yr Trend




Chart23: Fall to Fall Transfer Rate by Cohort Year – 5-yr Trend
