Who is Eligible?

Students must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5, and should apply to Dominican University the semester prior to graduating Triton College.

Evening BBA: Online/Hybrid Program

- Must complete the AAS degree before matriculating at DU.
- Can complete Illinois Articulation Initiative/General Education Core Curriculum (IAI/GECC) courses at either Dominican University or Triton College.
- Are strongly advised to complete MAT 110 or MAT 124.

Traditional Daytime Program

 Can matriculate at DU before completing the AAS degree (a minimum of 30 transferrable credits is required).
