# English as a Second Language (ESL)



Do you want to improve your English so that you can communicate better, support your child's education, get a job or get a better job, go to college or be more involved in your community? We are here to help!

English as a Second Language (ESL) classes serve non-native English speakers who want to develop or strengthen their reading, writing, listening and speaking skills in English. Classes are free and offered online and in person.

### **CLASSES OFFERED**

There are a variety of classes to choose from:

• **15-week ESL classes** meet in the mornings (Monday and Wednesday) and evenings (Tuesday and Thursday).

• 10-week ESL classes meet in the mornings (Tuesday and Thursday) and evenings (Monday and Wednesday).



- Citizenship classes prepare eligible, legal, permanent residents for the United States naturalization process. Students may take citizenship classes more than once, if necessary. All citizenship classes and materials are free. Class topics include: the application; US government; US history; US Constitution and Declaration of Independence; and the USCIS interview.
- **Digital literacy classes** help students improve technology skills and prepare for college or the workforce. Three levels are offered to students currently enrolled in class. Topics include Computer Basics, MS Word, Excel and PowerPoint.

**Step 5:** Receive an enrollment verification email (close to class start date).


**Step 6:** Attend New Student Orientation.
